Pastor's Pulpit

Advent (Christmas) and Easter (Lent) tend to be synonymous with March weather ... "In like a Lion, out Like a Lamb." There is so much build-up to the celebration of Christ's Birth, and in comparison, so little emphasis on Christ's Resurrection. Maybe because Santa offers so much more than the Easter Bunny? I don't know. But there really is something to be learned in this seeming paradox.

You would think that St. Francis' Peace Prayer would fit more into the Christmas season ... if nothing more than to just bring some sanity back to our lives in the midst of the hustle and bustle! But to tell you the truth there are seasons in life that are just as mind-numbing and draining as any Christmas season.

Prayer of St. Francis Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.

Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; and where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand; to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive; it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen

Let's consider the peace prayer and its teaching for the Easter Season as well. Because let's face it, now is a good time to remind ourselves who and Whose we are and the Great Hope that is ours because of our relationship with the One who is both the Babe of Bethlehem and the Crucified Savior of Calvary.

Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace:

We do need to start at the beginning. Only those who know ... not know about, but know ... Jesus can really address Him as *Lord*. For us, we know that we have been bought with a price—His precious blood. We know that He has a perfect plan for our lives. We know that all things do eventually work for the good for those who love Him. We know that in reality all of our lives are lived before Him with an awareness that we really do love Him, and we love Him because He first loved us. We also know that we can and will be used by Him for Him. We are called to be His spokesperson. In fact, as believers, we already "speak" for Him whether or not we actually use words. Can we not like Francis sit back and consider our high calling and look at the myriads of people all around us, and see the frazzled looks as people go by and whisper to Him, *make me an instrument of your peace*. I'm willing. Just guide me and remind me daily who I am and what I promised You I would be about.

where there is hatred, let me sow love;

Not too hard to find *hatred* in our world. Hatred, prejudice, anger, resentment, inequality, class segregation, being a Chief's fan or a MAGA enthusiast. You know all those things that can just really rub us the wrong way. Then of course when we think about it, issues are one thing, but anger, when elevated gets personal awfully fast. And personal anger oftentimes simply lumps groups together and our shared humanity seemingly gets buried under the hatred we oftentimes don't even know we are displaying.

I've often thought that God made people to speak different languages, to have different skin colors, and to display certain cultural characteristics to simply test us all. But more, to test believers in Him the most. The *other* really does become the *other*. Exclusivity becomes so ingrained that we don't recognize it. Too often to be the one who sees the anger and to bring the opposite into any situation is well, too dangerous in most people's minds. You could get hurt that way! What if we really did live up to the promise we made to Christ about being an instrument of His peace? Would we be more willing to try to diffuse situations, correct people, and call things what they are despite what it may cost or the emotion it may give rise to? Love "sowers" are few and far between. But then again it depends on your perspective about who and what Christ came to do and be.

where there is injury, pardon;

Ironically, an injury that needs to be pardoned has to be a personal injury. Lots of folks have the "Peter syndrome" who asked Jesus just how many times he actually had to forgive another person if they asked for it ... to which his seven times answer earned him the Lord's ... seventy times seven. I honestly think that Peter did some quick math and thought to himself ... ok 490 times. I'll forgive someone 490 but one more time and watch out! .. 491 is my limit! There really is more of a call to be a forgiving person than any other quality we might want to develop. Why? Because that is the essence of the reason why Jesus came to be born, to live, and to eventually be put to death. It was for us. It was meant to be seen as personal.

God took our need to be forgiven so personally that He sent His only Son, not just to teach us *about* forgiveness ... but to *show what it cost*. *Pardon* is a lifestyle that is usually developed in folks who have taken deep stock and probed all if their past actions in light of how much it might have hurt someone, and really how much it hurt themselves. Thus, to be a forgiving person is also part of the promise to be that *instrument of peace*.

where there is doubt, Faith

I hope you do see a pattern emerging from the text. To have the peace **of** God, you first have to settle the question ... do you have peace **with** God? That peace only comes when you find the Mediator between you and God: the Man, the Savior, the Resurrected One, the Alpha and Omega, the Eternal **Lord**.

Ah yes, there is that word ... **Lord** again. Francis found that only when the Savior issue is settled, can we and do we, have peace with God ... and experience the peace of God. Then and only then, can we be the instruments that He uses to spread His peace to others. In our individual salvation experience, we find our overall mission and life purpose ... to simply be heralds proclaiming the message and the life that truly is encapsulated in one short phrase—**Instrument of your Peace.**

The remainder of the Peace Prayer is below and on the next page. I have provided spaces between each phrase for you to do some soul searching about how Francis's prayer should be not only understood ... but also put into practice. Take your time. Let some thoughts come in like a Lion ... and others just kind of go out like a Lamb.
