#### Pastor's Pulpit

April! NO more winter ... sorry, I jest!

This April is also representative of an event that has changed people's lives, people's hearts and people's destinies. That event? EASTER! The dark winter for humanity has opened up to the warmth and light of a new Spring, where real life began, and has continued now for over two millennia.

With Christ's Resurrection, there really was and is a new season for all of us. How? 2 Corinthians 5: 17 states, "<sup>18</sup> Now all things *are* of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation, <sup>19</sup> that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation. <sup>20</sup> Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore *you* on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God." These precious verses not only inform us of what God was doing for us (reconciled us to Himself) but also infer how we can in return, with thankfulness to God and love for God, prove those feelings by living life for God as His representative offering His reconciliation to others ("...we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore *you* on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God.")

Easter is such a blessed season of new life! It is interesting that most of us feel that our greatest characteristic of being a Christian has to be love ... after all, "for God so loved the world." But just as important and just as challenging is understanding what God did to prove that love. He took the initiative. He planned it all out. God was proactive in and with His love. In other words, He didn't just say something ... He did something. In a real way, if we're truly going to be like Christ, we not only have to say things and be loving, but we also should ever be about the business of reconciliation, which calls for forgivingness. It was our need to be forgiven that spurred God's love to action. Thus, if we are going to be imitators of God, we also should display a capacity and desire for ourselves to also be reconciled and reconciling, forgiving and being forgiven.

And of course, you can see where I am going with all this. We need to have some real reconciliation within the four walls of our church. We need to see ourselves as recipients of God's love and forgiveness, but also be people who do and act the same. I believe reconciliation is totally possible and biblically mandated. We can, as a church, stand strong knowing that we can endure the different storms that all churches that are doing the right spiritual things go through.

If we do not as a church at least try to reach some form of reconciliation within the church family, we will be only setting a pretty unhealthy precedent for any future family squabbles that will arise. There are no winners in a divided church. Well, only one ... God's enemy.

For my part, I want my motivation to be love, but I want my action to start with what reconciliation demands — forgiveness. And I need to ask for your forgiveness. I really do and I really am. Bernice and I have believed, and still do feel, that God has vocationally saved the very best for last. I do seek forgiveness from those who have yet to accept my request. I can and do, offer my love and forgiveness in return.

In any case, we are given this opportunity in this great Spring month of April to display God's dual characteristics of reconciliation and love. We can do it!!

### A Prayer at the Cross


