PASTOR'S PULPIT

The dog days of summer are upon us! Even so, summertime is great! Lots of families travel or spend the summer with relatives and friends. The challenge is: how can I be the very best example of being a Christian when my children or relatives (and especially my grandchildren) come around or I have them staying with me? Below are some ideas. Some are good ... some are OK ... others may be a bit impractical Still, there are enough ideas listed to get you started thinking and praying.

- 1. Choose a Gospel to read as a family (Matthew, Mark, Luke or John).
- 2. Pick two chapters per week from "*Keeping Your Kids on God's Side*" to discuss as a family.
- 3. Watch the "*What's in the Bible?*" DVD series together. This 13-DVD series takes kids all the way the way through the Bible.
- Ke 30 Things You Can Do This Summer to Deepen Your Kids Faith
- 4. Schedule a "questions night" a time for your family to get together and discuss any questions your kids have about God.
- 5. Have your kids interview a believer/nonbeliever.
- 6. Choose a news story with a faith angle to talk about.
- 7. Find a way to serve others together as a family.
- 8. Attend Vacation Bible School. VBS is a fun week offered by many churches for kids to play and learn together. And you don't have to just go to the one offered by your church –attend one at another church and get to know more people!
- 9. Pick a relevant single word to focus on and discuss.
- 10. Invite your pastor over for dinner. Depending on the size of your church, your kids may never have actually interacted with your pastor. Invite him to dinner and give your kids the opportunity to ask questions they may not want to ask you (or that you may not know how to answer)!
- 11. Read or watch a debate between a Christian and a nonbeliever. Debates make for great discussion opportunities with older kids.
- 12. Do an internet research project together. Pick a faith-based subject to Google with your kids (e.g., "Did Jesus exist?").
- 13. Watch a science DVD series from a Christian perspective. This collection is great: The Intelligent Design Collection Darwin's Dilemma, The Privileged Planet, Unlocking the Mystery of Life.

- 14. Learn about Christian persecution worldwide. In many countries, Christians are being persecuted. *Open Doors USA* is one organization that works on raising awareness of this.
- 15. Encourage your kids to invite a friend to church.
- 16. Get *The Belief Book* by David McAfee and discuss. This is an atheist book written directly to kids which explains that religious beliefs are just holdovers from ancient people who didn't know how to explain the world. It's filled with inaccurate caricatures of faith and would be an excellent discussion tool for older kids.
- 17. Introduce logic games.
- 18. Visit a different church (another denomination or religion).
- 19. Break down the meaning of a worship song.
- 20. Get a new Bible game to play as a family.
- 21. Take a family spiritual inventory and act on it accordingly. Have each family member write down what they feel is good about your family's spiritual life and what could use improvement.
- 22. Write letters to God.
- 23. Print an internet meme to discuss.
- 24. Do a Bible timeline activity.
- 25. Go to a Christian bookstore together and pick out a devotional.
- 26. Pick a magazine and hunt for examples of the secular worldview throughout the articles. For example, with a teen girl, you could pick a popular teen beauty magazine. Get two copies—one for you, one for her. Have each of you go through and circle examples that are in conflict with a Christian worldview. Compare and discuss.
- 27. Play *"What would you say if ..."*. Here are a few examples: What would you say if your friend's mom said God doesn't exist? What would you say if someone told you the Bible is 2,000 years old, so it's not relevant for our lives today? What would you say if someone told you Christians are hypocrites so they never want to be a Christian? What would you say if someone told you say if someone told you they believe in science, not God?
- 28. Create a family prayer list.
- 29. Role-play being an atheist and have your kids try to convince you that Christianity is true. This can be an eye-opening experience for all involved and show you what subjects you should study together going forward.
- 30. Read a religion research study together and discuss. The Barna Group does a ton of interesting research about religious belief and activities in America. Their studies could lead to many interesting conversations with older kids and trends in our country and what it will mean to them to be a Christian in an increasingly secular world. Here's one research example that just came out: *The End of Absolutes: America's New Moral Code.*

Like I said, some are good ... some are OK ... but the point is you do have influence in the life of the folks you love and who love you. Create a memory! Be about the Lord's business. Be faithful. Be blessed. *Blessings, Pastor David*

Dear Church Families,

Almost a century ago, American Baptist Churches in South Dakota, known as "the Convention", partnered together to realize a vision for Christian camping ministry in the founding of Camp Judson. Through the years **Camp Judson** has experienced much growth and change, yet the ministry of the camp has remained faithful to their primary mission of evangelism.

As God has consistently and abundantly blessed the ministry of Camp Judson, the camp's lodging capacity is now 260 and the dining hall capacity is 300. However, the capacity of chapel is only 120. In order to provide adequate worship and meeting space so Camp Judson remains an exceptional Christian ministry for current and future generations, we are launching a **capital campaign** to raise funds to build a new Roger Williams Lodge. The new Roger Williams Lodge will provide a larger chapel space, multiple meeting rooms, indoor activity space, and modern bathrooms, while remaining the central hub of camp activities.

The Camp Judson Capital Campaign Steering Committee is planning a "Campaign Kickoff" event at Camp Judson on Saturday, August 28th at 1:00 PM. The kickoff event will coincide with the SD Men's Round Up weekend, and all churches are invited and welcome to attend.

The Steering Committee is also asking our churches to help find volunteers willing to present campaign information to donors who have previously given gifts to the camp. Brief training sessions, campaign materials, and donor contacts will be provided to the volunteers by Chuck and Tim Hiatt, Campaign Consultants.
