## Pastor's Pulpit:

As a Rotarian, I am asked to speak at our weekly meeting from time to time. I had the opportunity this past week to share about the Hot Springs Ministerial Association: who we are, what we do, and how we pay for the help that we do provide. I thought I would share with you what was presented.

## HOT SPRINGS MINISTERIAL ASSOCIATION

#### WHO WE ARE:

The **HSMA** was formed by local churches in 2004. The goals were pretty simple: helping the needy (Food Pantry, assistance vouchers); serving our community; meeting together as ministry leaders for mutual support; and announcing the Good News of Jesus Christ.

#### WHAT WE DO:

We people with: paying rent, needing propane, lodging, overdue phone bills, overdue electric bills, food needs and so on. We work with landlords, local motels, Black Hills Electric, the VA, the Hot Springs Police and Sheriff departments, and others. We *do not* distribute any cash to meet any need. We operate solely on a voucher system. As you can see on the voucher sample located on page 8, we do have limits as far as the amount of assistance we provide. Sometimes we can extend an additional amount if the situation warrants (larger families, etc.). We always encourage people to utilize the food pantry, if at all possible, for food needs. We also encourage people to participate in the monthly food distribution provided every 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday in Butler Part by Feeding South Dakota. Like our voucher system, all participants are electronically registered to try to guard against those who might want to take unfair advantage of the system. When an individual comes in for assistance, they first are checked for past assistance. We provide every church and pastor with a monthly updated list of every one who has utilized our voucher system. (We keep very good records and do have some folks who have abused the system and are on the "do not help" list.) After a person had provided ID, and stated their need, we discuss how we can proceed and then send them to the Police Station for a background check to make sure we are not helping or abetting anyone.

I personally tell people that if they do not have car insurance and they are trying to get a gas voucher, or if they have a need for a motel, and have an outstanding warrant, that our police department will arrest them—and they have. Once the voucher is complete we then can provide payment to whichever entity we are working with in helping the individual or family. It's just a good system of trying to keep everything above board. Have we been taken advantage of? Sure, sometimes it takes the Wisdom of Solomon to try to discern people's motives and so on. And let's face it sometimes you just have to trust your gut in certain situations.

## HOW DO WE PAY FOR IT?

It was pretty interesting, because in my talk at our Rotary Club, I actually had Kay Birkholt share the financial part of how the HSMA operates. Kay not only runs our Food Pantry, but also works in writing grant requests and pursuing local partnerships. But surprisingly, the very large majority of our funding comes simply through our great community.

Organizationally, we solicit funds usually in November and December though our **Hot Springs Cares Campaign**. These funds support both our food pantry and "needy" funds. In addition, the HSMA has bought the current building (across the street and down a bit from the Post office) for the Food Pantry and future expansion. I believe we are going to be initiating a capital campaign to hopefully, eventually pay off our mortgage. It's a good and worthy cause if you feel the desire to share.
